"From Glen's Analytical Table we learn that a tune named 'Dunse Dings A' ' was printed in Neil Stewart's 'A Collection of the Newest and the Best Reels, or Country Dances, Adapted for the Violin or German Flute', Edinburgh 1761-62. Dunse is a town in the Lowlands, a few miles from the English border, that gave name to several tunes. 'Dunse Dings A' ' signifies in plain English 'Dunse surpasses or excels all', an exaggerated yet pardonable expression of local pride."
